He called Archimedes and told him to prove the same without damaging the crown and thereby proving the goldsmith as rouge.

Thinking about the problem, Archimedes walked slowly home. He sat down and tried to find out a solution. Engaged in deep thought, he decided to have a bath. A servant prepared the bath, but lost in thought, Archimedes did not notice that it had been filled to the brim with water. He slowly undressed and stepped in to the bath. Of course, the water overflowed on to the floor.

Here was the answer! He leapt out of the bath and, still naked, ran down the busy street, past the market-place to the palace. People starred at his unclothed figure as he ran past them shouting, "Eureka, Eureka!" which means, "I have found it, I have found it." This is how the Archimedes principal came into existence which states that any object, wholly or partially immersed in a fluid, is buoyed up by a force equal to the weight of the fluid displaced by the object. Applying the same rule Archimedes solved the problem of the crown and assessed the purity of the same.


